Call for research proposals: "Understanding STI Co-infection In At Risk and HIV Infected Adolescents and Young Adults"

The National Institutes of Health (NIH) is seeking applications for a program entitled "Understanding STI Co-infection In At Risk and HIV Infected Adolescents and Young Adults" with an aim to facilitate improved understanding of the interactions between HIV and STIs in the adolescent genital and gastrointestinal mucosa.

Deadline: 17 August 2016. NICHD intends to commit **\$1.1 million** in FY 2017 to fund 1-3 awards.

MTV Staying Alive Grant: Small Grants to Youth led CBOs working to fight HIV in most Innovative Ways

MTV Staying Alive Grant program invites young people, passionate about HIV awareness, to contribute towards fighting HIV globally. Program will particularly, but not exclusively, fund organisations which work with key at risk populations, including adolescent girls, LGBTs, sex workers, prisoners and injecting drug users.

Currently 6 projects form EECA are being funded in the following countries: Poland, Romania, Moldova, Macedonia, Armenia and Tajikistan.

Deadline: 28 August 2016

Funds Available: Every successful grant applicant will receive up to \$12,000 of funding for 1 year to set up an HIV awareness project in their community.

BACKUP Health: altered procedures for consultancy mode applications

BACKUP Health offers government and civil society partners to apply for Technical Support in order to **improve their capacity and raise** effectiveness of the Global Fund programs.

Deadline: 31 December 2016 Budget ceiling: EUR 80,000

Only Kyrgyzstan is eligible for Intervention Areas modality, but **all countries receiving Global Fund funding** apart from EU member states

can request Flexible Support.

Flexible Support is provided in order to overcome bottlenecks impeding the work of Global Fund recipients and partners or threatening to block Global Fund processes. Flexible support may, for instance, be offered for:
measures linked to any of the stages of the Global Fund process — from applying for grants to implementation, evaluation, monitoring, and risk mitigation;

• preparing for the next Global Fund disbursement or funding phase — i.e. helping principal recipients to fulfil the preconditions for disbursement.
