# CRG TA Program: summary of key points to remember

- This is a **short-term** TA Program all the planned activities should be implemented, and results achieved within 3 months
- It could take up to 3 months between the submission of the request and the beginning of TA provision
- The TA is being provided by the pre-selected TA providers
- Experts can be deployed for approximately 30 days over a period of up to three months.
- From the experience of the previous CRG TA phase in EECA: budget of one TA could vary from 15 000 to 50 000 USD
- The content of the request need to be coordinated with broad range of civil society partners involved into the national level Global Fund processes. Also, it is strongly recommended to coordinate the content of the request with the CCM and fund portfolio manager
- Applicants must contact the CRG EECA Regional Platform for assistance in shaping the request prior to submission to the Global Fund.
- There is no limit on how many requests could be submitted from one country over the phase of the CRG TA Program implementation
- Could not be supported:
  - Strengthening of Country Coordinating Mechanisms
  - Long-term capacity building of civil society organizations
  - Any stand-alone activities that lack a focus on community engagement into GF related processes
  - Funding request writing
  - Direct service provision

### **Example of the CRG Short-term Technical Assistance in 2020 - Kazakhstan**

TA Request was submitted in: December 2019

TA was requested by: Kazakhstan Union of PLWH

TA Budget: 27 500 USD

TA Provider: ECOM

**Period of TA provision:** February – May 2020

**TA Objective:** strengthen the engagement of KPs in the development of the country proposal for the HIV Global Fund grant for 2021–2024

#### **Example of supported TA activities:**

- Organization of number of one-day group consultations with activists and heads of NGOs (separately for each KP)
- Conducting the meetings with representatives of government agencies and international organisations to agree the community priorities with the government vision
- Summarizing the results of the civil society country dialogue to be included into the country proposal

## Example of the CRG Short-term Technical Assistance in 2019-2020 - Tajikistan

TA Request was submitted in: May 2019

**TA was requested by:** NGO "Gender and Development"

**TA Budget:** 50 732 USD

**TA Provider:** Canadian HIV/AIDS Legal Network

**Period of TA provision:** August 2019 – February 2020

**TA Objective:** assessing the stigma, gender and legal barriers to accessing TB services in Tajikistan

#### **Example of supported TA activities:**

- Conducting desk review in four research areas: legal environment, gender, key populations and stigma.
- Collection of the field data including conducting of in-depth interviews and focus groups
- Data analysys and preparation of the assessment report
- Presentation of the assessment results to the local and international stakeholders.
- Development of the action plan to promote the assessment results.
