INCLUSIVE VIRTUAL DIALOGUES AND MEANINGFUL ENGAGEMENT OF COMMUNITIES

- The meaningful engagement of communities and civil society must continue during COVID-19. The CCM Eligibility Requirements remain unchanged.
- 2. Regardless of the IT capacity in a country, crucial to invite participants to the dialogue and to transparently and publicly share how and when to participate, and drafts of funding requests
 - Increase expected on the investment focused on Civil Society additional to the 15% required in the CCM Funding Agreement.
 - Consider and tailor to telecommunications capacity of all participants, including communities
 - Document lessons learnt and input from affected communities.
 - Need for data privacy and protection when engaging with communities and civil society via virtual platforms (platforms with end-to-end encryption should be favored given the risk of criminalization, discrimination, and persecution)
- . Meaningful engagement of key and vulnerable populations to ensure efforts and response are not further discriminating and excluding those most at risk.

COMMUNITY SYSTEMS AND RESPONSES

- 1. Community networks should be supported to deliver services, to avoid treatment disruptions and provide peer virtual support (where restrictions disallow face to face service provision)
 - Community outreach workers, community treatment supporters, peer educators should be enabled to provide remote support (ex. provided with mobile data credits).
 - Ensure psychosocial support to people living with/affected by the 3 diseases and KVP; including addressing the stigma aspects related to the diseases and the possible need of isolation.
 - Ensure continuity of comprehensive HIV / HCV and other low-threshold services through take-home dosing and flexibility in dosing and adapting NSP programs to be less reliant on hand to hand distribution.
 - Community-led monitoring: Support communities to monitor and report service disruptions, commodity stockouts and human rights violations
 - Apply a gender and age lens to best respond to COVID-19 and the three diseases.

HUMAN RIGHTS IN TIMES OF COVID

- GF remains committed to human rights and gender equality, including in it is decision-making around COVID-19. Rights-based and gender-responsive approaches will enable countries to best respond to COVID-19
- Any COVID-related changes will strive to ensure barriers to health services are not exacerbated and health needs and human rights of those most vulnerable are met.
- PRs/SRs must continue to adhere to the five minimum human rights standards in grant agreements. If a violation of these standards occurs, report it through the Global Fund's Office of Inspector General's I Speak Out Now form, email ispeakoutnow@theglobalfund.org, or call the hotline +1 704 541 6918.
- Programs to remove human rights and gender-related should be maintained/ strengthened and tailored to provide support to COVID-19 response and those most affected, including health care providers.
 - Monitoring human rights violations and referring to support and mechanisms of redress
 - Access to legal support
 - Managing GBV/IPV
