



~2.3 million people were living with HIV in the WHO European Region, 2021




UNAIDS Targets for 2025

LESS THAN 10% OF PLHIV AND KEY POPULATIONS EXPERIENCE STIGMA AND DISCRIMINATION

95% PLHIV AWARE OF THEIR STATUS
95% ON TREATMENT
95% VIRALLY SUPRESSED





How satisfied are you with your life?*




*Scale 0-10, where 0 is not at all satisfied and 10 is completely satisfied



Self-stigma of respondents






Experience of stigma by markers of depression within last 2 weeks




Proportion of respondents who have ever told people in their life about their HIV status






Experiences of stigma from friends, family or sexual partners, by how recently the experience occurred



Experiences of stigma in healthcare settings, by how recently the experience occurred






Experiences of stigma by Life Satisfaction Score






Experiences of stigma in dental care, by how recently the experience occurred

Conclusions



- First time we have European-wide data on experienced stigma among PLHIV
- 1 in 5 PLHIV have not told a single friend
- 1 in 3 have not told a single family member
- High levels of experienced stigma from 'family and friends', and even higher levels of experienced stigma in 'healthcare settings'
- Stigma within the healthcare setting demonstrates that there is still a lot of work to be done to make people living with HIV feel safe in these settings
- As we hope to repeat the survey leading up to 2030, ensuring that the data on experienced stigma is representative of all PLHIV will be important

HIV-related stigma is highly prevalent and more efforts are needed to address stigma in order to improve the quality of life of people living with HIV
