

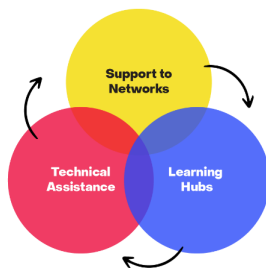

- to facilitate synergies, collaborations and partnerships among Component 2 partners, EECA Regional Platform and communities and civil society at the country level.

Updated Global Fund's Mpox Technical Brief



Technical Brief Prevent, Detect and Respond to Mpox

[The Global Fund's Mpox technical brief](#) has been recently updated to align with: (a) current guidance from WHO and Africa CDC; and (b) the GC7 and C19RM modular frameworks. See Annex 1 for the full list of interventions supported by the Global Fund.

Main updates to the brief include:

- Overview of the situation since 2024, the new WHO declaration and new guidelines.
- Expand on enhancing disease surveillance and human resources for health interventions.
- Targeted programming including community-based prevention, engagement and systems strengthening.
- Interventions highlighting the importance of women-led and gender diverse monitoring and response.
- Infection prevention and control measures tailored to mpox.
- Targeted vaccine service delivery.

Please note that impacted countries have the opportunity to reprioritize Global Fund grant investments (in line with usual processes) to prevent, detect and respond to mpox, in line with the updated technical brief.

Global Fund Sustainability, Transition and Co-financing Policy: A Comprehensive Overview



Following the discussions on the sustainability related issues which took place at the recent 51st meeting of the Global Fund Board which was held in Geneva from April 22 to 24, 2024, the Strategy Committee has drafted an improved the Global Fund's Sustainability, Transition & Co-financing (STC) policy framework.

This document will probably be discussed at the next Global Fund Board meetings.
