IAS Warns: Halting Funding to the PEPFAR & Stop-work Order for Existing Grants and Contracts Places Millions of Lives in Jeopardy





On Day 1 of taking office as US President, Donald Trump signed an <u>executive order</u> that banned any new government spending on foreign aid projects. This was followed by an unexpected <u>"stop-work order"</u> issued on 24 January, which means that funding to <u>U.S. President's Emergency Plan for AIDS Relief</u> (PEPFAR), even for existing grants and contracts, is frozen.

PEPFAR is the largest commitment by any country, ever, to address a single disease. Since

it established PEPFAR in 2003, the US government has invested over USD 110 billion in the global HIV response. It has saved 26 million lives and prevented millions of HIV acquisitions in more than 50 countries.

As PEPFAR itself states: "PEPFAR's lifesaving work is enabled through the U.S. government's unwavering commitment to the program and the American people's compassion and generosity, as PEPFAR ensures every U.S. taxpayer dollar is optimally focused for impact."

Webinar: Opportunities for Community Engagement during the Grant Making stage of the Global Fund's Grant Life Cycle



There are a number of EECA countries eligible for the Global Fund's funding within the GC7 which are currently at the Grant Making stage of the Global Fund's Grant Life Cycle. While community engagement is visible in the initial stages of the country dialogue process including community consultations and funding request development, it is observed that community engagement at the Grant Making stage is limited and the opportunities for such engagement as well as the Grant Making process itself is unclear for the civil society and communities' representatives.

To further strengthen community engagement at this stage of Global Fund's Grant Life Cycle, <u>EECA Learning Hub</u> in collaboration with <u>TB Europe Coalition</u> are aimed to organize

a webinar to raise awareness among communities and civil society in the region on available guidance, opportunities and best practices of community engagement during the Grant Making and share the lessons learned.

The Pandemic Fund: Call for Proposals



The <u>Pandemic Fund</u> announced its <u>third</u> <u>Call for Proposals (3rd CfP) on December</u> 19, 2024, with an envelope of <u>US\$500</u> <u>million</u>. Recognizing the high demand for funding demonstrated in the first and second CfP, the 3rd CfP continues to: **prioritize high-impact investments in**:

- 1. early warning and disease surveillance systems,
- 2. laboratory systems, and
- 3. strengthening human resources/public health and community workforce capacity, including workforce capacity related to human and animal health.

Financing is intended for projects that will help strengthen core capacities in one or more of these three priority areas, which present the promise of generating a visible impact in terms of prevention and preparedness to effectively detect and respond to disease outbreaks.

Further, in line with the Pandemic Fund's medium-term <u>Strategic Plan</u> additional emphasis will be placed on strengthening two cross-cutting enablers, National Public Health Institutes (or relevant public institutions) and regional/global networks, organizations, or hubs aimed at bolstering the institutional foundations that support information sharing, coordination across public health and One Health systems, and rapid action.
