## Global Fund 70 Million Reasons Why Campaign Film



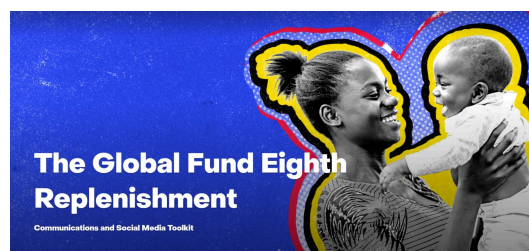

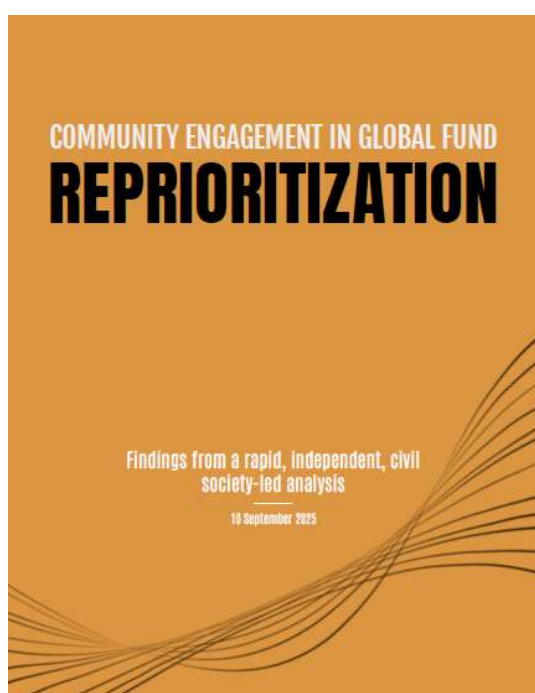

## Report: Community engagement in Global Fund reprioritization



The Global Fund is currently working with CCMs and Principal Recipients to reprioritize grant activities in Grant Cycle 7 (GC7) to safeguard and enable lifesaving interventions. Reprioritization measures were introduced to ensure continuity of life-saving programs during a period of financial uncertainty.

This report presents the results of the survey aimed to measure community engagement in the reprioritization process, including assessing access to information and resources, inclusion in processes, consultations, and other dynamics impacting meaningful participation.

The survey was initiated in August 2025 by the Data Etc, the Global Advocacy Data Hub, CHANGE, [EHRA](#), Women for Global Fund (W4GF) and a number of other civil society partners.

### ***Report covers findings on the following:***

- Access to guidance from the Global Fund Secretariat;
- Sources of information about the reprioritization process;
- Clarity of reprioritization communications;
- Community engagement in the process;
- Facilitation and tools for engagement;
- Deprioritization of community-focused programs.
