### RFPs: Effective Communities to Support Persons with Disabilities (Ukraine)

**URGENT** | Deadline: 3 August 2026 (5 days remaining) | Funding: Up to UAH 700,000 | Duration: Up to 6 months; expected start 1 September 2026

**Eligible geography:** Ukraine — all government-controlled areas; priority communities in Odesa and Chernivtsi regions

**Themes:** Disability; Health; Community Development; Civil Society Development; Human Rights; Stigma reduction

Community-level grants to strengthen inclusive support, rehabilitation access, independence and participation of people with disabilities through sustainable local partnerships.

**Eligible applicants:** Ukrainian non-profit CSOs registered no later than 31 December 2024, not registered in occupied territory, with relevant experience and sufficient organisational and financial capacity. Projects must be able to reach at least 300 people with disabilities.

**Partnership / co-financing:** Collaboration with local authorities, community leaders, disability representatives, businesses and other stakeholders is expected. Co-financing: Not stated.

**Key conditions:** People with disabilities and community representatives must participate in implementation or monitoring. Eligible costs include staff/experts, events, materials, communications, travel, small equipment and accessibility measures. Applicants must explain the practical link to the target community.

**Important note:** Urgent deadline.

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## **Call for Applications: Strengthening Gender Equality Movements**

**URGENT** | Deadline: 7 August 2026 (9 days remaining) | Funding: EUR 225,000–450,000 per coalition | Duration: 3 years: January 2027–December 2029

**Eligible geography:** EU, UK, Armenia, Bosnia and Herzegovina, Kosovo, Montenegro, North Macedonia and Serbia

**Themes:** Women and gender; Human Rights; LGBTQ; Civil Society Development; Movement building

Long-term coalition funding to strengthen grassroots and intersectional gender-equality movements, collaboration, community organising, cross-border advocacy and narrative change.

**Eligible applicants:** Coalitions of at least three legally registered organisations. Grassroots groups working with marginalised women, girls, transgender, non-binary and gender non-conforming people are prioritised; networks and intermediaries may participate with grassroots partners.

**Partnership / co-financing:** Mandatory coalition of at least three legally registered organisations. Co-financing: Not stated.

**Key conditions:** Eligible project support includes salaries and overheads. Priority is given to intersectional work with low-income, migrant, racialised, ethnic-minority, rural, disabled and other marginalised communities.

## **Request for Applications: Strengthening Community Activities in Municipalities (Lithuania)**

**URGENT** | Deadline: 11 August 2026 (13 days remaining) | Funding: EUR 1,000–4,000 | Duration: From grant agreement signature to 23 December 2026

**Eligible geography:** Lithuania — Marijampolė municipality

**Themes:** Community Development; Civil Society Development; Health; Youth and adolescents; Media literacy; Social entrepreneurship

Municipal funding for community participation, volunteering, cultural and health activities, youth engagement, social support, public spaces, community safety and local services.

**Eligible applicants:** Community organisations and their associations with a registered NGO label. In specified circumstances, other NGOs and religious communities or associations with an NGO label may apply.

**Partnership / co-financing:** Partners are permitted where applicable. Co-financing: Not stated.

**Key conditions:** One application per applicant. Long-term tangible assets may account for up to 30% of the budget. Applications must be signed and complete at submission; applicants cannot later correct, supplement or amend them on their own initiative.

**Important note:** Urgent deadline. Grant size is below the original monitoring threshold but retained at the user's instruction.

**Eligible geography:** Kazakhstan

**Themes:** Health; Community Development; Civil Society Development; Disability; Social welfare; Environment

Capital-focused grassroots support for practical projects that improve community welfare, healthcare, social services, safety and socio-economic development in Kazakhstan.

**Eligible applicants:** Local authorities, medical and educational institutions, NGOs with at least 10 employees, public organisations and public foundations. Applicants need more than two years of relevant successful experience and financial stability.

**Partnership / co-financing:** Not stated as mandatory Co-financing: Not stated.

**Key conditions:** Funding is mainly for equipment, construction or renovation, small infrastructure and independent audit. It does not cover administration, taxes, bank charges, land, office equipment, travel, utilities, operating costs, food, medicines, clothing, scholarships or research. Supported assets must not generate profit.

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### [Long-Term Grants for Women's and Feminist Human Rights Organizations \(Ukraine\)](#)

**NEAR-TERM** | Deadline: 16 August 2026 (18 days remaining) | Funding: Up to CAD 50,000, paid in UAH equivalent | Duration: Up to 18 months

**Eligible geography:** Ukraine — all regions

**Themes:** Women and gender; Human Rights; Civil Society Development; Economic Development; Climate justice

Long-term catalytic support for women's and feminist organisations advancing gender equality, women's rights, economic empowerment and women's participation in Ukraine's recovery.

**Eligible applicants:** Officially registered women's public organisations from any region of Ukraine. Applicants must have at least three years of experience, a chartered focus on women's rights and/or gender equality, and no affiliation with state institutions or political parties.

**Partnership / co-financing:** Networks, coalitions and platforms are within scope; no mandatory partnership rule stated. Co-financing: Not stated.

**Key conditions:** Proposals should offer an innovative, scalable and sustainable model with measurable early results. Eligible themes include military and veteran families, reconstruction, women's leadership, climate justice and organisational sustainability.

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## **Small Grants Supporting Community Recovery and Development (Ukraine)**

**NEAR-TERM** | Deadline: 27 August 2026 (29 days remaining) | Funding: Optimal project budget: UAH 1,000,000–1,500,000 | Duration: Up to 12 months

**Eligible geography:** Ukraine — 15 specified regions; Kyiv-based organisations may qualify if they work in eligible communities

**Themes:** Civil Society Development; Human Rights; Democracy & Good Governance; Women and gender; Community Development

Supports local and regional civil society initiatives that contribute to Ukraine's recovery planning, inclusive community development and organisational strengthening in regions most affected by hostilities.

**Eligible applicants:** Local or regional public organisations, public unions, charitable foundations and self-organisation bodies with at least one year of experience. Teams must be physically present in Ukraine. Relocated organisations may apply if re-registered in government-controlled territory and able to demonstrate continued engagement with their original region.

**Partnership / co-financing:** No formal partnership requirement stated; partnership development is part of the programme. Co-financing: Not stated.

**Key conditions:** Applicants must be registered in an eligible region. Selected teams must participate in the in-person organisational development programme. Priority groups include veterans, internally displaced people, people with disabilities and other vulnerable groups.

### Call No. 7 for Bilateral Cooperation in Civil Society Sector

Deadline: 31 August 2026 (33 days remaining) | Funding: Up to EUR 25,000 | Duration: Up to 12 months

**Eligible geography:** Slovakia with Iceland, Liechtenstein or Norway

**Themes:** Civil Society Development; Human Rights; Democracy & Good Governance; Capacity building

Supports structured partnerships, peer learning, exchange of expertise and capacity building between Slovak civil society and organisations in the EEA donor states.

**Eligible applicants:** Non-profit, voluntary and non-commercial civil society organisations based in Slovakia or Iceland, Liechtenstein or Norway and independent from government, political parties and commercial entities.

**Partnership / co-financing:** Mandatory bilateral partnership: at least one Slovak organisation and one entity from a donor state. Co-financing: Not stated.

**Key conditions:** Religious institutions, political parties, social partners, profit-sharing cooperatives and informal groups are excluded. Activities should create durable added value through networking, mutual learning and transfer of know-how.

### CFAs: Small Grants Scheme for Heritage-Related Projects

Deadline: 7 September 2026 (40 days remaining) | Funding: Two grant bands: up to EUR 10,000; or EUR 10,000–25,000 | Duration: Not stated in the collected notice

**Eligible geography:** Albania; Armenia; Azerbaijan; Bosnia and Herzegovina; Georgia; Kosovo; Moldova; Montenegro; North Macedonia; Serbia; Ukraine

**Themes:** Civil Society Development; Human Rights; Democracy & Good Governance; Community Development; Cultural heritage

Supports civil society-led heritage projects that build organisational capacity and use cultural heritage to advance green, digital and social transformation, democracy, peace and reconciliation.

**Eligible applicants:** Civil society and not-for-profit organisations, including NGOs, charities and grassroots organisations, based in one of the 11 eligible countries.

**Partnership / co-financing:** Applications may be submitted by one organisation or a partnership. In a partnership, one lead submits a single budget and assumes contractual and financial responsibility. Co-financing: Not stated.

**Key conditions:** Projects must be heritage-related and led by civil society in an eligible EU candidate or neighbouring country.

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### **Applications open for Project Grants (Czech Republic)**

Deadline: 15 September 2026 (48 days remaining) | Funding: EUR 25,001–100,000; organisational development grants up to EUR 80,000 | Duration: 18, 24 or 36 months

**Eligible geography:** Czech Republic

**Themes:** Human Rights; Civil Society Development; Democracy & Good Governance; LGBTQ; Women and gender; SRHR; Immigration; Climate action

Project grants for Czech civil society organisations protecting democratic values and human rights, strengthening organisational resilience and supporting disadvantaged groups.

**Eligible applicants:** Independent non-profit civil society organisations established in the Czech Republic, including eligible associations, institutes, public benefit corporations, foundations, endowment funds and qualifying church-related entities.

**Partnership / co-financing:** Check the selected grant type Co-financing: No co-financing required.

**Key conditions:** Grant streams cover general democracy/human-rights projects, organisational development, Roma empowerment and challenges arising from the invasion of Ukraine. Expected start: January or April 2027.

Horizon Europe research funding on migration and asylum governance, legal pathways, migrant and refugee health equity, health data and long-term integration across housing, work, education and participation.

**Eligible applicants:** The notice lists broad international participation. Applicants should verify Horizon Europe consortium composition, country funding eligibility and topic-specific admissibility in the official call documents.

**Partnership / co-financing:** A multi-country Horizon Europe consortium is expected; verify the formal minimum composition in the call conditions. Co-financing: Horizon Europe funding rules apply.

**Key conditions:** Proposals should use comparative and interdisciplinary methods, address intersecting vulnerabilities and develop evidence-based recommendations. Privacy, data governance and equitable access to healthcare are central.

## **RFAs: Addressing Gender-Based Violence Against Women and LGBTIQ+ People**

Deadline: 23 September 2026 (56 days remaining) | Funding: EUR 3,500,000–4,000,000 expected EU contribution per project | Duration: Not stated in the collected notice

**Eligible geography:** Broad EU/international eligibility; relevant EHRA countries listed in the full table

**Themes:** Women and gender; Human Rights; LGBTQ; Research; Democracy & Good Governance; Digital safety

Horizon Europe research on online and offline gender-based and politically motivated violence against women and LGBTIQ+ people in public and political life.

**Eligible applicants:** Any legal entity, including organisations in non-associated third countries and international organisations, subject to Horizon Europe conditions. Beneficiaries and affiliated entities must register and obtain a PIC.

**Partnership / co-financing:** Multi-country and interdisciplinary research partnership expected; civil society, affected people and stakeholders should be involved throughout. Co-financing: Horizon Europe funding rules apply.

**Key conditions:** Research should address harassment, hate speech, disinformation, cyber abuse, deepfakes and media narratives through an intersectional lens. Data should follow FAIR principles. Inclusion of men and boys in prevention is encouraged.

**Eligible geography:** Estonia; donor-state partners may participate

**Key conditions:** One lead application per organisation; unlimited participation as partner. Eligible partners include public/private entities, CSOs, international organisations and eligible informal groups. Expected start: January 2027.

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### **Call for Applications: Rolling Call for Small Grants (Bulgaria)**

Deadline: 29 September 2026 (62 days remaining) | Funding: EUR 10,000–25,000 | Duration: 6–12 months

**Eligible geography:** Bulgaria

**Themes:** Human Rights; Civil Society Development; Democracy & Good Governance; Women and gender; Community Development; Climate action

A simplified small-grant mechanism for Bulgarian organisations working on democracy, human rights, participation, social justice, organisational development and challenges linked to the invasion of Ukraine.

**Eligible applicants:** Independent civil society organisations registered in Bulgaria as non-profit legal entities or chitalishta and meeting the legal and organisational conditions.

**Partnership / co-financing:** Not stated as mandatory Co-financing: No co-financing required.

**Key conditions:** Political parties, religious institutions, social partners, cooperatives and bodies serving only narrow professional interests are excluded. Smaller and community-based organisations are specifically encouraged.

Healthcare-focused grant round supporting governance and regulatory reform, evidence-based policy, workforce and institutional capacity, integrated care and quality improvement in Armenia.

**Eligible applicants:** Applicant eligibility is not specified in the collected notice; confirm organisational and registration requirements on the official page.

**Partnership / co-financing:** Not stated Co-financing: Not stated.

**Key conditions:** This quarterly round focuses on strengthening systems that support quality care. Relevant activities include guidelines, standards, oversight, training, curricula, regional capacity, integrated pathways, data-informed improvement and continuity of care.

**Partnership / co-financing:** Not stated as mandatory Co-financing: Not stated.

**Key conditions:** Religious institutions, political parties, social partners and profit-sharing cooperatives are ineligible. Applicants must sign the programme's Declaration of Honour on protecting vulnerable people and children.

**Eligible applicants:** Non-governmental and non-profit organisations legally established in Romania, including eligible associations, foundations, federations, recognised foreign legal entities operating in Romania and Romanian Red Cross structures with legal personality.

**Partnership / co-financing:** Check official call conditions Co-financing: Check official call conditions.

**Key conditions:** Projects should mainstream human rights across design and implementation and may combine advocacy, policy engagement, legal accountability, awareness and work with underserved communities.

**Key conditions:** Projects should strengthen relationships between citizens, civil society and public authorities, especially where historical exclusion and socio-economic inequalities limit participation.

Supports long-term projects addressing persistent rights violations, structural discrimination, legal protection, institutional accountability and social inclusion in underserved communities.

**Eligible applicants:** Non-governmental and non-profit organisations legally established in Romania, including eligible associations, foundations, federations, recognised foreign legal entities operating in Romania and the Romanian Red Cross structures with legal personality.

**Partnership / co-financing:** Check official call conditions Co-financing: Check official call conditions.

**Key conditions:** Projects should use a human-rights-based approach and may address migrants and people displaced by the war in Ukraine, environmental rights, advocacy, legal remedies and systemic reform.

**Key conditions:** Projects should cooperate with the EU Drugs Agency to validate outcomes and with CEPOL on police training. Associations, affiliated entities, associated partners, entities without legal personality and international organisations may participate under the call rules.

**Eligible geography:** Kyrgyzstan; Tajikistan; Turkmenistan; Uzbekistan

**Themes:** Democracy & Good Governance; Civil Society Development; Human Rights; Technology; Digital security; LGBTQ; Women and gender; Youth and adolescents

Rapid-response support to help local civil society withstand imminent digital and broader civic-space threats and continue working towards inclusive democracy.

**Eligible applicants:** Local civil society organisations, groups or social movements, formal or informal, working to expand civic and democratic freedoms and promote inclusive democracy in the digital age. Individuals are not eligible. Priority is given to marginalised actors, including women, youth, grassroots and LGBTQ+ groups. Applicants should not have received CIVICUS Crisis Response Fund support in the previous two years.

**Partnership / co-financing:** A single organisation may apply; joint applications by two or more organisations qualify for the higher funding ceiling. Co-financing: Not required / not stated.

**Key conditions:** The request must address an imminent civic-space threat and constitute a practical resiliency response, not general advocacy or unrestricted core support. Applicants must be able to track expenditure and provide monthly receipt-based financial reports. CIVICUS indicates an approximately eight-week processing, contracting and initial-disbursement period. At least 60% of the budget should fund project activities; up to 30% may cover personnel and up to 10% overheads.

**Important note:** The fundsforNGOs card supplied for this monitoring round lists a deadline of 31 December 2026 and a grant-size band of USD 10,000–100,000. The official CIVICUS page instead states that applications are accepted year-round on a rolling basis and sets the current ceilings at USD 10,000 for a single applicant and USD 20,000 for a joint application. Official conditions are used in the main fields.

**Key conditions:** Eligible actions include exchanges, internships, training, workshops, study visits, research, publications and campaigns. Personnel, travel, expert, translation and directly related implementation costs may be covered.
